TFL Freedom Pass

From Monday 15th June the Freedom Pass will not be able to be used during the morning peak hours or 04.30 to 09.00 in order to support social distancing on the public transport network. Passengers with a Disabled Person's Freedom Pass are unaffected. Passengers are being advised, where possible, not to travel immediately after 0900 to help reduce potential crowding. It is said this will be temporary, but not date yet for when it will be lifted. – John Rich.

TFL Children's travel

A Zip Oyster has until now allowed children who live in London Boroughs to travel for free on London buses. This free travel is being scrapped or suspended temporarily (depending on which newspaper you read) and it is understood that the fare will be 75p, but information is patchy on the facts so apologies for the lack of detailed information but having talked with some parents they weren't aware there was even a plan for this to happen. – Fiona



There is a need to remain vigilant over **bogus callers**

Under the government's new arrangements, if any of us comes into contact with a person who develops the coronavirus, we may be telephoned by someone from the government's new "test and trace" programme. There is some concern that bogus callers might see this as an opportunity to try to steal information by pretending to be part of this government programme, so here are a few things to look out for.

Genuine callers who are part of this programme will use a single phone number - 0300 013 5000 - and any text messages they send will be from "NHS".

They will only refer you to websites that are owned by the government or the NHS, and the most likely one will be the NHS test and trace contact-tracing website.

The personal information they are likely to ask for will be your name and date of birth, and your postcode.

They WILL NOT:

ask you for any financial details or payments, or passwords, PINS or login details; they will NOT ask you to ring a premium rate phone number (eg beginning 09 or 087) and they will NOT offer medical advice about your symptoms.

If you receive a phone call that you are uncertain about, you can check with the NHS England Test and Trace Service Website. If you do not have internet access, the best thing to do is probably to contact a friend (or perhaps your pastoral Elder) who has a computer and may be able to check for you. And of course if you are suspicious, do not give out personal information.

If you yourself develop coronavirus symptoms you will need to report this and order a test, which you can do either via the NHS website or by ringing 119.
